A preacher who commits to biblical preaching will not only experience personal growth, but will see evidences of growth in his congregation through effective application. Students will be instructed in making the Scripture clear, understandable, and relevant, challenging listeners to grow in Christ. This class will focus on the step-by-step process for sermon development.

Attention will be given to the development of a multi-level comprehensive spiritual growth program for the local church which will include: Basic Discipleship, Intermediate Discipleship, and Advanced Discipleship. A ministry-matching approach will be introduced which will allow a pastor to match the ministry needs of the local church with the gifts and calling of its members.
