This course is an analysis and exposition of Daniel, concentrating on both its historical background and prophetic themes. Topics for discussion include Nebuchadnezzar's image, the four beasts, Daniel's seventy weeks, the Antichrist, the tribulation, and the millennium. Also discussed will be those vital lessons learned from Daniel's interaction with the civil governments of his day.
